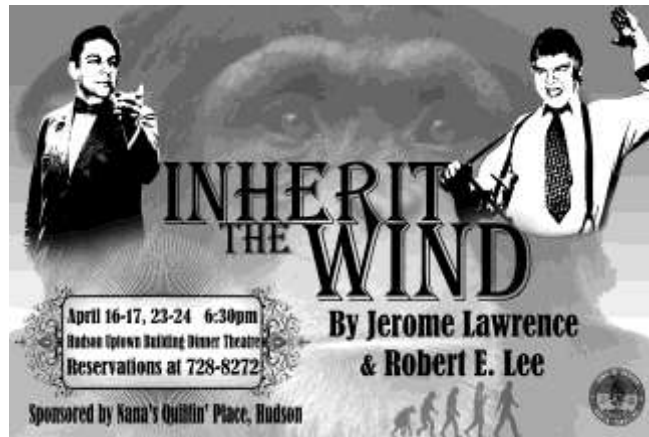


The Town of Hudson

Inherit the Wind, one of the most popular dramatic plays in American History, is based on the events of the 1925 Scopes Monkey Trial in Tennessee. Bertram Cates, a local school teacher, is on trial for teaching the theory of evolution and the case pits two great lawyers against each other. (historically, Clarence Darrow and three time unsuccessful American Presidential candidate, William Jennings Bryan). Even more on trial is the God-given right for human beings to think. The play is very effective at blending history with drama and is as entertaining as it is thought – provoking.
